Dear Friends,  
*How is the resurrection good news for you?*  
Go ahead.

I'll wait. Come up with anything yet?

Why am I asking you to consider that the resurrection is good news for you? Because, as followers of Jesus who have been at this thing for some time [most of us for the better part of our lives] we are so accustomed to having others - pastors, Sunday school teachers, even religious television personalities - tell *us* why *they* feel the resurrection matters.

We forget that on that first Easter morning, the resurrection honestly wasn't immediately thought of as "good news" to those first few people who went to the tomb that day. They went to the tomb believing they would discover not an empty tomb, but the decomposing body of their rabbi, teacher and friend,

But instead, Jesus was not where they left him, was he?

He was risen!

So for those first believers, they had to do the heavy lifting of asking the question: what does the resurrection mean? And, how is this good news?

For them they still lived in an occupied state. Rome still held its clenched fist tightly around Israel's neck. They were still grossly over taxed. Their friends and neighbors we sometimes taken away on trumped up charges. Their Jewish way of life was still threatened. And now, their beloved rabbi Jesus was nowhere to be found.

But after the fog of confusion wore off, we're told that they actually did believe, even in the face of all of the above: they did believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. And, their belief sparked a worldwide revolution of which you and I are now a part.

Amazing isn't it!?

To be sure, most of us still struggle, even though we believe with all that we are that Jesus wasn't in the tomb that first Easter morning. We too, like those first ancient followers of Jesus, still live in a world that would have us believe otherwise.

We still struggle with bad habits, addictions, behaviors that don't honor or reflect the image of Jesus that God is trying to form in us, and maybe even some of us wrestle with a lack of faith.

Yet we believe.

So, let me ask you again: why is the resurrection good news for you? How have you sensed the power and presence of the resurrected Jesus in your life in the past 12 months?

You and I are part of a grand story of God's redemptive love for the world; God's desire to put the world to right again, undoing what Adam and Eve had done in the Garden. Because you and I are part of that story, we have a story to share: stories of our own personal encounter with the resurrected Jesus.

And, if we can understand why the resurrection is good news for us, then we can share our stories with the world telling them why we think that the resurrection is good news for them.

So why is the resurrection good news for me? I'm glad you asked. The resurrection is good news for me because on that first Easter morning Jesus rose to deliver me [and all the world] not just from the *consequences* of sin, but from its *power* as well.

For me the good news isn't simply the promise of a great afterlife that waits for me someday in the future, but it is also a dynamic reality that gives me the power to live in and partner with hope that the world that God originally created and called good, is on the path to healing and restoration. No longer must I be defined by my lowest and most painful moments and experiences, but I serve a God who takes pain and redeems it in the broken body of God's son in order to offer the entire world a second chance.

So let me encourage you this Easter to consider your own personal response to how you believe that the resurrection is good news for you.

## Who's Who at Good Shepherd?

**Kay Ferguson** was born in Flint Michigan on September 20, 1926. She was raised on a farm out side of Clio, Michigan and graduated from Clio High School. For a short time she attended MSU where she sought to earn an Administrative degree.

Then, Kay met Manton Ferguson and the couple was married on July 29, 1950 at the United Methodist Church in Clio.

Manton had a young daughter named Carol Lou so Kay became a wife and mother all in one day. The couple adopted a little boy named Ronald Lee. Their family has been blessed with three grandchildren and five step grandchildren.

In 1953, the couple moved north to the Houghton-Higgins area. Manton would jokingly tell people that they came north on vacation but had to stay because it cost too much to go home. Manton found work at the Hub grocery store, then the Ford garage (which is now Spicer's Boat City), and finally retired from the State of Michigan at Camp Nokomis. Kay worked as an office manager for an auto dealer in Clio. After moving north, she took a position with Houghton Lake Accounting. Before retiring, she worked another ten years preparing income tax returns in her home.

Kay says that she and Manton enjoyed snowmobiling, camping, deer hunting, pheasant hunting, and especially ice fishing. They had a huge ice shanty with an apartment size stove in it where she would cook their meals as they spent the day on the frozen lake. In fact, they loved doing anything outdoors. Kay says she's still an outdoors girl today. When summer time comes she says her house work suffers because you'll find her out side enjoying her flowers and the sunshine.

As Charter members of Good Shepherd, Kay remembers the day they moved into the new Good Shepherd church. She said "We began our service that day at the Masonic Temple. The idea was to have an exodus and entrance celebration that day. During the



middle of service at the temple everyone stopped and began to pick up items that belonged to the church and put them in their cars, we then all caravanned over to the new church building." She said "I was carrying paper products into the church and as I was walking down the center isle of the church I could feel GOD'S PRESENCE enter our church. Later I was telling my husband what I had experienced and he said felt the same thing." When Kay told me this story the first thing that came to my mind was when the Holy Spirit rushed into the room to enter the disciples. It's so awesome to know that God has blessed Good Shepherd from the start.

Kay said that over the years at Good Shepherd she has held almost every office in the church except Pastor (lol). The two jobs she had that she felt particularly blessed by was her service in Vacation Bible School and as UMW Treasurer. She held the treasurer's position for about thirteen years.

Look for Kay at the first service or between services at the adult "Seekers" class. Kay is such a sweet person and you will be so blessed to get to know her and call her friend!

### Applying Bible Principles

Money is a neutral commodity, a means of exchange. It is neither inherently good nor evil. But a wrong view of money can become a problem to us.

In 1 Timothy 6:9-10, Scripture warns about the dangers of a determination to get rich: "People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs."

When we have a consuming desire to get rich, when we are obsessed with money so that it becomes the focus of our time and attention, then we have made it the number one priority in our lives. In that spot, it replaces everything, including God. We begin to find our security in money, not in God and in God alone.

However, when our view of God is right and our view of money is right, we will realize that money cannot buy security; money cannot purchase happiness; money cannot guarantee peace or joy or contentment. God alone can provide these essentials as we "... seek first his kingdom and his righteousness."

In his book, *The Gift of Giving*, Wayne Watts said this: "God always lovingly instructs us in the path that is in our best interest and which will bring us the greatest happiness in life. Therefore, for our good, He instructs us to put Him first in all things, and this includes how we use our money."

How do you view money? Is it at the center of your life, thereby perhaps replacing God's rightful role? And equally important, are you using the money God has given to you to advance His kingdom and His righteousness?
